1.1 Programme description

Objectives

The Bachelor's degree study program in Spanish Language and Literature opens the way for the acquisition of basic knowledge and respective competences in fields of Linguistics, History, Literature and Culture of Hispanophone Countries, including Spain. Input language level corresponds to the Common European Framework Reference for Languages, i. e., B1, output language to level C1.

Learning Outcomes

After successfully completing his/her studies the graduate is able to:

- write and speak in Spanish with a Pre-Proficiency C1 level according to the Common European Framework of Reference for Languages (CEFR)
- think independently and critically in areas that demand a wide-ranging knowledge of Spanish in its cultural and language context
- have a broad knowledge of the social, political, cultural and historic background in Spain and other Hispanophone (Spanish-speaking) countries
- have a solid knowledge about the structure of Spanish language as a specific Romance language, as well as its varieties
- use the basic professional abilities in the fields of translation and teaching of Spanish

Occupational Profiles of Graduates

Graduates with this degree can write and speak in Spanish with an almost Pre-Proficient level. They are equipped with a broad knowledge of the social, political, and cultural situations in Spain and other Spanish-speaking countries. In addition to access to professional careers the fields of translation, interpretation, editing, journalism, and tourism, they are equipped with the necessary skills adaptable to other professions: the ability to think independently and critically and to express themselves in both their mother tongue and Spanish.

Practical Training

Practical training is not required.

Goals of Theses

A standard scope of a Bachelor's thesis is about 80,000 characters including footnotes, list of literature, etc.; supplements do not count in the scope of characters. Bachelor's thesis has the character of graduation thesis where students should demonstrate the ability to work critically with specialized texts and apply their acquired knowledge in their own research adapted to their level of studies. Students can focus either on linguistic or literary oriented topics. The student selects the subject of her/his thesis, pending on consultations and approbation of her/his thesis tutor or director, who recommends a methodology and primary reading. The undergraduate must consult with her/his thesis tutor on a regular basis.

Access to Further Studies

Graduates can continue to the Master's degree study programs in Spanish language and literature, Spanish language translation, North American cultural studies (if the previous major or minor study was English), and Upper secondary school teacher training in Spanish.

Course objectives

The aim of the course is to familiarize students with basic linguistic terms and history of linguistics, especially of the Romance linguistics.

Teaching methods

Exposition and definitions of basic terms of linguistics; overview of developments in linguistics, emphasis is placed on Romance linguistics.

Assessment methods

Examination – written test (minimum: 70%).

Learning outcomes

The student will acquire basic knowledge of general and Roman linguistics, which are necessary for subsequent study of specific linguistic disciplines.

Syllabus

General linguistics part: Differentiation of terms; language segmentation, language plans, utterance and utterance typology, functional sentence perspective. General and particular linguistics, typology, kinship and classification of languages. Romance languages part: Origins, differentiation and contemporary status of Romance languages. Final part: Overview of developments in linguistics, emphasis is placed on Romance linguistics. Overview and analysis of main linguistic schools (European as well as others) and their propositions.

A part of the course is the theory of realism and naturalism, which is treated in the course from the texts of the same authors, as well as by critics and theorists.

The objective of the subject is to get in touch and acquire analytical and intellectual skills in relation to the most important texts of Spanish literatures of the so-called "Spanish Golden Age": Sonnets and Eclogues of Garcilaso, Lazarillo de Tormes, Buscón, Quijote, Fabula of Polifemo and Galatea and Soledades (Góngora), Sonnets of Quevedo, etc. It is a subject in which the history, society and ideologies of the period are studied, but focusing mainly on the ideological revolution carried out by Garcilaso. The topics covered also contribute to know and understand the bases of the intellectual and cultural imaginary of the fields of cultural production in Spain and Latin America, since it is very canonical material, appropriated differently by different ideological horizons.

Teaching methods

Classes are divided into conference and seminar, but the time devoted to this is proportionally greater. Texts are read and commented and commentaries are presented and discussed. This project can deal also with the interpretation of an author or work of the period by other scholars, intellectuals or writers, for example, the Romantic interpretation of Quixote. That is to say: works are analyzed, but also interpretations of works. We are interpreters of interpreters. The theses of the work presented and defended are discussed with the rest of the classmates, who may have previously read (as this is optional) the work. Participation in class is, therefore, fundamental. It is not about "transmitting" basic objective knowledge that is easily accessible on the internet, or through manuals. The first part of the class provides some of this knowledge and teaches access to the sources of information available at the university and at digital level.

Assessment methods

Essay, class presentations, exam.

This subject is basic to know the foundations of the Spanish literary tradition. In other words, fills an important gap in the knowledge necessary to pass the SZZ. Course objectives

During last 150 years, a period corresponding roughly to the existence of a „modern homosexual“ identity in Europe, several millions of non-heterosexual people have lived in what is now the Czech Republic. The aim of this course is to provide students with a systematic insight into the past of this country from the perspective of the situation of these people, be their respective identities labeled as „sodomites“, „urnings“, „tribadists“, „homosexuals“, „lesbians“, „gays“ or, most recently, „queers“. Since about 20 years ago, this focus has produced quite a large amount of research in the historiography of the Czech Lands, which will thus make it possible to address a rich range of topics during the course.

Teaching methods

One 2-hour lecture per week.

Assessment methods

For the assessment, students will be given a choice between: (1) oral exam or (2) written test covering the topics presented during the course and an essay on a topic linked to the course focus. This will account for 70 % of the final mark. Lecture attendance will account for 30 % of the final mark.

Learning outcomes

During the course, students gain insight, from various perspectives, into the developments of the situation of non-heterosexual people in the past of the Czech Lands, especially in the 19th and 20th centuries.

After completing the course, a student will be able to:

- explain main features of the development of situation of queer people in Bohemia, Moravia and Silesia, setting them in a broader (Central-)European context
- launch his or her own research into queer history, if he or she wishes so

Syllabus

Lectures will be structured around these axes: (1) Issues of identity (construction of the homosexual subject: role of medicine, media freedom, foreign influences, trans-generational tradition etc.; medical experiments aimed at the „treatment“ of homosexuality) (2) Persecution of homosexuality (judicial persecution based on the Criminal Code of 1852, extra-judicial persecution during the WWII, forms of discrimination during the Communist era) (3) Emancipatory movements (first attempts before 1918, the Czechoslovak League for Sexual Reform in the 1930s, limited possibilities for civic activism between 1948-1989, contemporary Czech LGBT movement after 1989) (4) Everyday life (with a focus on the 1930s and 1940s, based on archival sources produced by police institutions, and on the 1960s to 1980s, based on oral history research) (5) Homosexuality in arts (depiction of homosexual experience in Czech literature, theatre, cinema and the visual arts; popular culture as a source of „gay folklore“) For the needs of international students, the issues addressed will be, as necessary, set within a broader context of the Czech history. Comparison to other national contexts will be encouraged. The course stems from a long-term research interest and published works of the lecturer (inter alia, co-founder of the Society for Queer Memory in Prague).

Course objectives

This a subject devoted to the Libro de buen amor, a fascinating piece of literature of Spain XIVth century. The course focuses on history, contemporary literature, classics (Ovid), scholastic discourse and philosophy, style, interpretations, etc.

Teaching methods

Classes are divided between lecture and discussion. Attendance is compulsory, as well as reading the whole literature. Student writes an essay and prepares a presentation, which implies more specialized reading. Reading is distributed, depending on time availability.

Assessment methods

Written examination; essay presentation.

Learning outcomes

The subject enables the understanding of the ideological functioning of the works of the social formations of European Feudalism. Given the theoretical complexity, the capacity for distancing and analysis of the student is reinforced. S/he gets in touch with the metrical and rhetorical forms of fundamental medieval works. Since Spanish is medieval, linguistic knowledge, language history, lexicon, etc. are improved. Reading skills are substantially increased, written expression (presentation, examination), oral expression (presentation), capacity for discussion and argumentation on a difficult topic are also increased. Student is also trained in the ability to analyze and comment on texts.

Course objectives

The course offers a cognitive map of the subject and a theoretical reflection on utopian and dystopian literatures. At the beginning, it covers a wide range of historical texts and literatures of utopias and its negative correlate, the dystopian literatures. After an introduction on the conceptualization and writing of utopian texts, from Greco-Roman literature and the Renaissance, the subject focuses on three fundamental texts of Western dystopias: Zamiatin, Huxley and Orwell. From these novels, we later turn to read and comment on "School of mandarins" (1972), by Miguel Espinosa. It is finalized considering the extension of the dystopian genre in contemporary literature and cinema (Handmaid's Tale, Brazil, Hunger Games, etc., etc.), as well as other novels, for example, Vladimir Sorokin'a The day of the Opricnik.

Course objectives

The objective of the course is the Spanish realistic and naturalist novel, syncretizing the external influences (cultural imports and transfers from France and England, Dickens, Balzac, Flaubert, etc.) and the Spanish tradition itself (Quixote, picaresque). Realism-naturalism is opposed to Modernism, focusing on Rubén Darío, and ends with the so-called "generation of 98" and the ideological crisis of the end of the century, the birth of the figure of the intellectual, until the outbreak of the Great War. It is a course in which the development of literary ideologies from the nineteenth to the twentieth is studied in conjunction with the avatars and historical conflicts that characterize the era of bourgeois revolutions, colonialism and the scientific and philosophical boom of the nineteenth century.

Teaching methods

Lectures, class discussion. Seminar: analysis of chosen texts
homeworks, reading,

Assessment methods

Exam. Active participation in the seminars. Mandatory readings Credits are obtained for attendance and active participation in the course and after successfully completing a final test. The student has to demonstrate (in seminars, presentations and exams) his ability to connect theoretical knowledge with the analysis and interpretation of literary texts.

Learning outcomes

Reading skills are substantially increased, written expression (presentation, examination), oral expression (presentation), capacity for discussion and argumentation on a difficult topic are also increased. Student is also trained in the ability to analyze and comment on texts.
